Richard Broughton of Calvert County having solicited his ~~Lord~~
for license to keepe a Ferry in Potomac River ~~and~~ it was
thought necessary and convenient for conveyance of publick Messengers
over Potomac River and the East^{erly} of the Inhabitants having occa:
sion aboard ships and over y^e said River that a Post be kept
at Alhcombes plantation according to y^e request of R^d. Broughton
and ord^r. of Council accordingly was directed to the said Broughton.

By the Lord Prop^r. & Council

Ordered that a Ferry be settled at Alhcombes plantation on
Point Patience in Potomac River for wa^{sh}ing over all publick
Messengers or other persons whatsoever that shall have occasion over
th^e said River on board ships or other wh^{er} in th^e said River, and
that Richard Broughton be and he is hereby authorised & empowered
to keepe the same during his ~~Lord~~ pleasure.
