

**Articles of Peace and Amity concluded & agreed upon
Between the right hon^{ble} Cecilus Lord Proprietor of the
Province of Maryland & Walter Lord Baron of Baltimore and the
Indians of Pascataway, Anacostant, Doags, Mibiwomans,
Masquishno, Mattawomans, Shingawawadick, Nangomaick Port-
-bacco, Lacap Langay and Shopleco the Twentieth day of April
One thousand six hundred sixty six.**

1. *Imprimis* the aforesaid Indians do ratify & confirm acknowledge & declare the sole power of constituting & appointing the Emperor of Pascataway to be & remain in the right hon^{ble} Cecilus Lord Proprietor of this Province & his heirs Lord Proprietors of this Province and do desire the Govern^r with what convenient speed he can to appoint an Emperor in the place of Walmeasco the second lately deceased
2. If any Indian kill an English man he shall dye for it
3. So much as the English cannot easily distinguish one Indian from another that no Indian shall come into any English plantation painted and that all the Indians shall be bound to call aloud before they come within three hundred paces of any English mans door ground and lay down their Arms whether Gun, bow or arrows or other weapon for any English man that shall appear upon his call to take up and in case no one appear that he shall there have his safety if he come near and that afterwards he shall by calling aloud endeavour to give notice to the English of his nooer approach And if any English man shall kill any Indian that shall come unpainted & give such notice & deliver up his Arms as aforesaid he shall dye for it as well an Indian that kills an English man and in case the English & Indians meet accidentally in the wood every Indian shall be bound immediately to throw down his Arms upon call and in case any Indian so meeting an English man shall refuse to throw down his Arms upon call he shall be deemed as an Enemy.
4. The Privileges of Hunting, Fabling, Fishing, and fowling ^{shall be} ~~be~~ reserved to the Indians Inviolably
5. That in case of Danger the Govern^r shall appoint a place to which the Indians of the aforesaid Nations shall bring their wives & children to be secured from danger of any foreign Indians and that in case the men of the aforesaid Nations chance to be killed that the women & children shall remain free & not be sent to the English.
6. That Nicholas Emerson do make the Indians of Nangomaick satisfaction for the damage by him done to their corn in case George Thompson & John Brown testify that the said Emerson did willfully throw down their corn about their corn field
7. That the Indians of Nangomaick shall remain upon the place where they now live and that Mucutabamon son to their late King be King over that people immediately under the Protection of the Lord Proprietor of this Province and Subject to no Indian whatsoever.
8. That John Roberts & Thomas Harris do pay the Indians of Shingawawadick One hundred & twenty arms length of Roan Oak for the Indian that was slain by them at the head of Portoback Creek in August last
9. That every Indian y^t killeth or stealth a hog calf or other beast or other Goods shall undergo the same punishment that an English man doth for the same offences
10. That the several Nations aforesaid shall continue upon the places where they now live and that the hon^{ble} Govern^r do desire to lay out their full bounds as to him is just shall seem right for the publique good behoove
