 move either to Mattawoman Choptico or Zachaia according
 to the kind of Capt. Brandt Letter foregoing, it was
 advised and concluded on by his ~~Self~~ ^{Self} and his Council now
 present that Zachaia is the most proper place for y^e said Indians
 at present to remove themselves their wives and Children to
 untill such time as his ~~Self~~ ^{Self} can come to some treaty with the
 Simiquos and Susquehannocks and make some warm^t of Agreem^t
 with them both for y^e said Sasattoway and other our Neighbour
 and friend Indians thereby to remove from them all future
 fears and apprehensions of Danger they now ly^e und^r.
 Zachaia therefore is the place appointed as aforesaid for y^e said
 Indians to retire unto, and Capt. Randolph Brandt ordered to
 advise them that such is his ~~Self~~ ^{Self} will and pleasure

Forasmuch as the Emperour and great men of Sasattoway
 and other the Indians und^r his Subjection having great fears and
 jealousies of the Simiquos and Susquehannocks Indians their
 Enemies have solicited his ~~Self~~ ^{Self} for leave to remove (for
 their better security) from the fort where they now live either to
 Mattawoman, Choptico, or Zachaia. His ~~Self~~ ^{Self} and his Council
 (having taken the same into their serious consideration, & willing to
 gratifie the request of the said Indians) Do say and Declare
 and it is hereby ordered.

That the said Sasattoway Indians have free hav^e and liberty with
 their wives and Children for the present to remove to Zachaia,
 and there to fort^y themselves und^r such fortifications as they shall
 think fitt to erect for their safeguard and D. fire until such time
 as his ~~Self~~ ^{Self} can have an opportunity to treat with the said Indians
 and with them compose some warm^t of Agreem^t and Conclud^e a
 firm peace as well for the said Sasattoways as all other Indians
 in league and Amity with him, thereby to remove from them all
