and have Consulted the Council about & request of the
Casattoway Indians to remove either to Mattawoman.
Proptico or Zachariah w^{ch} last mentioned place w^{ch}
have thought fit to pitch upon as the most proper at
this time, and therefore Inclosed find you the result of
the Council to that purpose, w^{ch} you are to communicate
to them with all expedition, I would have you endeavor to
get a sight of the Articles made with those Indians
now in their custody, and take due cognizance of every
particular Article for as to send me an Exact Acc^t of
their Contents, and also learn from them if possibly you can
whether they have since recd. any Addition or confirmation
of them, and (if so) that you also endeavor to get a sight
of them, and signify your proceedings herein with all
convenient speed to
