By order of the Hon. ^{right honorable} Lord Prop.
and his Council.

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O. w. h. you shall know or be informed that any of the Indians do come down into your parts you are to give speedy notice thereof to his L^{ty} and Council, and in your manner to advise Jacob Young that it is his L^{ty}'s desire that he should endeavour by all ways and means possible to speak with some of the great men and let them know that his L^{ty} is very desirous to continue the league and Amity with them and would willingly renew the same yearly by a mutual Interview of some of the great men of this Province and some of theirs in such manner and form as is usual with them on such occasions could he be acquainted therewith, and therefore desired that they will give his L^{ty} to understand where and at what time in every year near the Head of the Bay or elsewhere for their convenience in this Province they may be spoken with, and that they would ascertain the time and place for that purpose, all which when specified be signified to his L^{ty} and Council with all convenient speed, and his L^{ty} will take care that Jacob Young shall be satisfied for his care and trouble therein.

Ordered therefore that the said Henry Tripp having taken the oath of Commission &c. of the Quorum in the said County and taken his place in the County Court there accordingly as formally he hath done.
