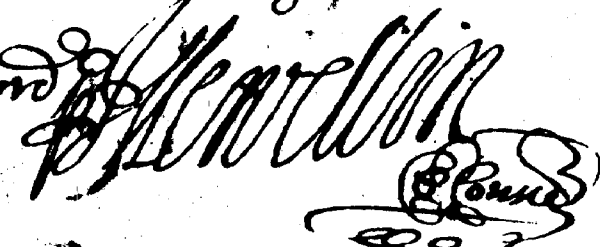


and by both parties referred to the Judgment of this Board, This the

 at the same time Joseph Wick and John Hinson and several others and the
 said Sheriff upon the present and reading of the for said order made his
 reply in answer thereto that he should willingly obey your ^{Supr} order and
 command in all things but as to the Estate that he had seized for y^e of

 Provincial Court and as for his dues to himself he would not deliver
 which being demanded to show a particular receipt of his dues he refused
 pretending he had it not about him but that the sum for his dues to him

 being required to pay himself the just price in tobacco which he seized in the
 said Humphrey's Estate due by bill of lading of the thousand pounds of tobacco from
 Benjamin Randall, which payment though undoubtedly he may have it in his
 possession yet notwithstanding refused to accept of the said tobacco in
