for ever all that building or structure lately erected by the Justices

of Kent County aforesaid (together with the consent and approbation

of the Inhabitants of Kent County aforesaid) being built only for

a Court house or house of Judicature for the said County and to or for

no other use intent or purpose whatsoever, together with a prison house

or common: together with adjoining being also lately erected, and also

all that lot or parcel of ground to the said Court house belonging -

as the same is now laid out by metes and bounds (that is to say) beginning

at a Locust Post standing by the first side at the South end of the

first Lot of the East Street and running for length two hundred

feet to another Locust Post, bounding on the East by a line drawn
