 Sterling for his appearance at the next Assizes to be of God's
 Service.

Then came Doctor Simon Weston and acknowledged
 himself to be owing & indebted unto our Sovereign Lord the
 King in the sum of Two hundred Pounds Sterl that he
 the said Weston should be & personally appear at the next
 Assize Court as witness for the King against the afores-
 named Thomas Johnson.

Ordered that William Gilly who officiated the place
 of our Highmths present Council be allowed for his trouble
 the sum of One hundred pounds of tobacco at the next
 laying of the Seavv
