

here at the Board together with Quasquetagh an Indian
commonly known & called by the Name of the Anacostin King
The Articles of Peace are read unto them

They are asked if they will acknowledge those Articles & stand
by them who do. Jointly make Answer that they are ready to
stand & abide by the same

Then it is demanded that they give an Account of the per-
son or persons who committed the late murder in Charles Coun-
ty being justly suspected to be Indians under their protection
and they make Answer they are ignorant who are the per-
sons concerned

Positive Demand is made by the Board that Quasquetagh
an Indian now present commonly known & called by the
Name of the Anacostin King be surrendered up to receive a
free Trial at Charles County Court. Nowe having perquirt
Circumstances to suspect the said Quasquetagh to be con-
cerned in the aforementioned Murder who after a long con-
sultation about the same had they consent to deliver up the said
Quasquetagh otherwise called the Anacostin King as a pris-
oner pursuant to the aforementioned Articles of Peace

Ordered that his Mitemus be accordingly drawn to be
kept in the Custody of the Sheriff of Charles County until he
be thence delivered by Due Course of Law the which accordingly
issued in these following Words viz

Mr Thomas Lawrence Baronec. President together with
the rest of their Majestys Council of Maryland to all. Hum-
bly Whose high Sheriff of Charles County Greeting You
have herewith under safe & secure Conduct sent you the Body
of Quasquetagh an Indian commonly known & called
by the Name of the Anacostin King this day surrendered up
unto us. Prisoner by the Ensign of Piscataways Good men
upon our Demand suspected to be concerned in a most bloody
and horrid Murder committed in & upon the Body of One James
Blake an Inhabitant within your County which said Prisoner
