His Majesty's Council is this day pleased to approve thereof and to the
Order as it is hereby Ordered, that the said Sir Thomas Lawrence do
enjoy the full benefit of his Office of Secretary of Maryland & to
according to his Letters Patent upon giving his own personal Security
in One thousand Pounds; and that each of the four County Clerks do
doe give One hundred Pounds Security for the due performance of
their respective places.

That the Act intituled an Act for Regulating Ordinaries pass'd
in the Assembly held in Maryland the Twelfth day of May last &
an Order of Council Dated the 17th of August following concerning
Chancery Writts be, as they are hereby, set aside & disallowed, and
that the benefit of issuing those Writts doe remaine to the
Secretary according to the Act of Assembly.

That there be no alteration in Reference to the Acts of the Naval
Officers as at present settled by an Act of Assembly in Maryland in con-
sideration of the trust reposed in the Governor for the due Execution
of that Office, And that the severall particulars proposed in the said
Report be duly complied with by all persons whom it may concern.
