

Thomas Martin
a Pet. for Warr.
of Refurvy

Thomas Martin of Talbot County humbly sheweth to this board that he is in possession of a certain tract of land situate adjoining upon a tract formerly belonging to Richard Gorsuch of the said County &c. lying upon the dividing line running out of Armstrongs Bay in Hopkock River in the said County beginning at the said Gorsuch Northwards bounded &c. being a red Oak marked with three Notches, both said tracts being parcels sold out of a greater tract called Shiverss Land, and are bounded as by the Certificates thereof remaining upon Record among the Records of the said County Court may more at large appear that he has for these several years been molested & troubled by the possessors of the aforesaid tract of Land of Gorsuch by trespassing (as he conceives) within his Bounds; therefore humbly prays Special Warrant may issue directed to the Surveyor of that County for the Refurvying of that aforesaid tract of Land of Gorsuch by a Jury of twelve Men of the Neighbourhood for that end & purpose to be summoned & sworn (as in such Cases is usually) according to the Antient Manner & Customs thereof, whereby he may find out the true Divisionall & true extent thereof, and that (if need shall require) he might likewise Refurvy his own Land, after the running forth of the other;

Whereupon it was Ordered, by advice in Council, as it is hereby Ordered, that Special Warrant issue according to the prayer of the Petition. And that the present possessors of the said Land of Gorsuch have Notice given to be present at the said Refurvy.
