 that if the said Thomas Greenfield shall not prosecute his  
 Appeal with Effect that he thereupon pay all Costs and  
 Damages that may happen to accrue to any person concerned, in  
 case that the Sentence of the said Judge shall be affirmed, by  
 reason of such his Appeals, who severally consented therunto

Ordered thereupon as it is hereby. Ordered that  
 an immediate Stop be put upon the proceedings of  
 the afor. Administration, and that the Adminis-  
 trators upon due Notice hereof given them yield all  
 due obedience therunto, until there be a full &  
 decision & determination in the premises.
