To which Demand of his Ex:cy

The Secretary and Members of the Council humbly offered the Reasons following  
for calling an Assembly, viz:

Council's Reasons for 1: That by a Proclamation issued by his Ex:cy the late Governo: Sopley and  
calling an Assembly - Council, Dated August 25<sup>th</sup>, 1693, it was thought fit for diverse weighty Reasons  
then appearing to them to summon the Assembly which had been continued from  
the 10<sup>th</sup> of May, 1692 by several Adjournments and Prorogations to Meet  
again on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of September 93, on which day the said Assembly did  
Meet accordingly and sat till the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the same Month; But  
the late Governo: Sopley dying on the 9<sup>th</sup> day of September, Mr Edmond  
Andros arrived the 25<sup>th</sup> with their Ma:ts Commission to take the afft  
Gov:mt: of Maryland and on the 26<sup>th</sup> dissolved the same.

2: The Members of the Council are of Opinion that the Reasons which aff  
Movd the late Governo: Sopley & Council to Convene the said Assembly  
do still subsist with greater Reason.

3: That whereas upon the accession of our: Governo: to his Government  
the generall Expectation of the Province is that an Assembly be called for  
the settling a more perfect understanding between the Governo: & Government.  
The Gentlemen of the Council do now upon their particular knowledge  
Rep:rt to your Ex:cy that the calling of an Assembly is both the aff  
Expectation and humble desire of this Province of Maryland in Order to the  
the passing of such publick Acts as may conduce to their Ma:ts immediate aff  
service and to the generall Good & advantage of this their Province.

for settling the publick Revenue; all Ma:ts touching the Protestant  
Religion according to the doctrine & discipline of the Church of England  
as relating to the persons of Church Men and Establishing on them a —  
competent Revenue; as also for erecting free Schools with competent Maintenance  
the paym: of divers of publick Debts due to the Rangers and for publick Enter-  
tainments and upon Bills of Exchange not paid with diverse other Reasons.

They do further desire that Mr Cheseldyn being formerly Speaker of the aff  
house of Burgesses may be sent for and asked about it, who accordingly appeared  
His Ex:cy was pleasd to ask him whether or no he thought the calling of  
an Assembly would be to the service of the King and good of the Country  
and what sentiments the Members of the house had upon the dissolution
