w^t their Ships unto the Mouth of Pekuxant River in Ord'r to Clear their Vessells
doe humbly move to Sayl notwithstanding a former Order of this Board w^t Commands
that noe Ships shoule be Cleared after the 13th of this instant Septemb^r: Setting
forth their being Stop^d by contrary Winds and bad Weather. Order'd therupon as it
is hereby Decreed that Whereas there is noe aduise as yet come to this province of the
Ships being gone out of Virginia the P^d Vessells be cleared notwithstanding the
aforemenioned Order.

Ordered that George Plater Esq^r their Maj^s Collector and Receiver Generall w^t sole
Cap: Paym^r Merch: in London to provide and send in by the first conveyance in a
Mon of Mar if one comes Shipp following Arms to the Value of Two hundred and
fifty pounds ster: out of the Quarter part of their Maj^s Revenue now remaining
in his hands but y^e he be silent in the doing thereof by Reason the Governm^r have noth^r
time to send al p^r sent Soc^l & Bournealls home esch are now preparing.

Arms as follows Viz:

1st Twenty Dragoons Bridles & Sabres.

Ten hand Mortars such as the two Companies at Sanger had sent them to him my
Lord Dartmouth eas there. To inquire of S^r Henry Goodrich or some other officers at the
Tower of the price and where theyeal^d had co^t one hundred hand Granados fit for those
hand Mortars and frizes co^t proper Waging and directions howe to fit them.

Half a dozen Instruments to trye packed with the rest of the 250 lbs to be laid out in Granado
carr Arms^r, Viz Slunges, Sanguines or otherwise fitted the best way to keep them
from the rest & Bayonets fitted for the base of those pieces co^t large Cartouch Boxes to
hold actioial two or three doz^r of cartridges (not to send good hatchets).

The Cartouch Box to goe upon^r belt and the Hatchet & Baguet in two hangers upon
same belt and pouches to carry the Granados in.

At about half yr: January it being debated at the Board whether his Exce^r S^r Comond Adm^r Commission here
going for England ex^r produced ought to have taken place there being found palpable contradictions between
the P^d Commission and his Exce^r proclamation and if in case it appear the P^d S^r Comond
doe take upon him this Government illegally whether or not Soc^l ill consequences may
not follow thereon; to w^t his Hono^r Col^r Greenbury made Answer that they doe not find
any person aggrieved but what they did co^t in regard to their Maj^s P^d Commission and they
believed the P^d S^r Comond came co^t a legall Commission but if it falls out that they shall
be call^d in question for it by the King he will goe home and Ask the King's parson
Wherupon his Exce^r does say that he may have leave to goe Abroon as he pleases and
that their Maj^s Service in the interim thereby will not suffer here.
