Councill praying that certain Articles enter'd upon into upon the Surrender of
Matapan in the S^d Letter inclosed might be enter'd upon Record & whereupon
Cap^t Good, Col^l Beale, M^r Cheselbyn & Col^l Warren being sent for and appearing
and Col^l Bowles then likewise so sent; his Exc^{ty} Demands whether the S^d Articles be
the paper sign'd by them and whether they think fit the same should be Recorded
-ing to M^r Josephs prayer; who for Answer returny the same in the paper they
Sign'd, and that they are not ag^t the Recording of it but wth all Signified that Cap^t Good
had by him their demand before the Articles Rec^d and afterwards their Acceptance
of the S^d Articles w^{ch} they pray may be Recorded together wth them Cap^t Good
promising to produce the same to this Board the Beginning of Next Week

they, w^{ch} me, may always pray.
