Ordered that the Pet^t Acco^t be made up and the gentleman imployed to inspect Col^t Blaiklons paper to make return according to former Order and that what is found due to their Mayth the quarter part thereof be applied pursuant to their Mayth instruction; as to the third Article he is desired to Mr. Pater for Advice and that he give an Acco^t to this Board what is become of the Kings third part of the S^d Bnk.

M^r Josephs Letter produced at the Board a Letter from M^r Josephs directed to his Exco^m the Gover^r and Council praying that certain Articles enter'd upon into upon the Surrender of Matapany in the S^d Letter inclofed might be entered upon Record & Whereupon

Capt. Good, Col^t Beale, M^r Cheshire & Col^t Warren being sent for and appearing and Col^t Bowles then likewise sent; his Exco^m Demands whether the S^d Articles be the paper sign'd by them and whether they think fit the same should be Recorded according to M^r Josephs prayer, who for Answer returning the same is the paper they sign'd, and that they are not ag^t the Recording of it but w^t all signified that Capt. Good had by him their demands before the Articles Acce^t: and afterward their Acceptance of the S^d Articles so they pray may be Recorded together w^t them Capt. Good promising to produce the same to this Board the Beginning of Next Week

Octob^r the 8th 1694

Capt. Good appears at the Board and was again read unto him M^r Josephs Letter & Articles about the Surrender of Matapany Upon w^t the S^d Capt. Good likewise produc^t the first Summons sent into the S^d Garrison together w^t the Surrender made Ordered by all the papers be entered in the Journall of this Board. w^t are as follows W^t m^y

Josephs Letter about the inclofed Articles have I carefully hitherto as well p^reserved as kept. Articles at Matapany they are the very Originall sign'd the Generall, Chief Officers, Commanders, or Grand Council of that time.

Seven of the Nine still live all or most now at S^t Mariet with the Clerk y^r W^t them; and in perpetuum Rei Memoriam Pray, they may be Enter'd and Recorded in such proper Books and Offices as yo^r Exco^m and this Hon^e Board Shall thinke fit, w^t b^r that in all and every part the same Inviolably be for ever kept, Observed and performed to all persons whom it doth or may concerne, y^r they, w^t me, may alwayes pray.
