 2^d desires a parley and personall Treaty, between us and some of you
 3^d for Answer we doe demand as in our Summons sent.
 4th That no Papiſt in this province be in any office Military or Civil
 by their Maj^{ties} proclamation and the Lawes of England.
 5th And wee do promise and Grant that you the Gentlemen and Soldiers now
 in Armes in your Garrison may return to you and their respective
 homes or dwellings In Obed^r to w^{ch} we doe assure you and them full
 conduct protection and security for you and their persons & attendants
 And wee will likewise protect you and them in the free & full Enjoyment
 of all your and their Just rights and priviledges Equall wth the rest of
 their Maj^{ties} Subjects according to the Lawes of England or the Lawes of
 this province.
 6th These are our absolute Resolutions concessions and demands to w^{ch} we
 desire you: immediate compliance being utterly resolved against any
 personall Treaty about the premises or any other Articles.
