

November the 13<sup>th</sup> 1694

The Council again Sat, and were Present, as before.

Mr. Wm. Bent made Assistant to the Attorney Gen.

Mr. Attorney General representing to the Board that there is so much Kings Business that he cannot possibly discharge his Duty without some further Assistance, ORDERED thereupon that Mr. William Bent be assistant to him therein in all Matters wherein he is not already Retained against their Maj<sup>ties</sup> who being present in Council did Accept thereof.

Capt. Gen. Mr. Cheselbyn & Madam Blackiston did bring in their Acc<sup>ts</sup> relating to the public Revenue &c.

ORDERED that Capt. Gen. Mr. Cheselbyn & Madam Blackiston Return an Acc<sup>t</sup> of what public Revenue of this Province &c. they are Accountable for, to his Ex<sup>ty</sup> either this Night or to Morrow Morning, upon Neglect or refusal whereof Mr. Attorney General is to make due proceedings against them according to Law. ORDERED that Mr. Gench bring in his Account wh<sup>o</sup> wife as Administrato<sup>r</sup> of Governor Copleys

The Council again Sat, and were Present, as before.

Ms. Bourn produces a Book & papers supposed to belong to shipping w<sup>ch</sup> she delivered to Mr. Randolph.

Came Madam Elizabeth Bourn Executrix of Mr. Sam<sup>l</sup> Bourn late Naval Officer of Piscataway District dec<sup>d</sup>: according to Summons sent her by his Ex<sup>ty</sup> who brought with her a certain Booke & other Writings, the Contents Unknown, and delivered the sam<sup>e</sup> unto Edward Randolph Esq<sup>r</sup> Surveyor General of their Maj<sup>ties</sup> Customs and Deputy Auditor under the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> William Blathwayt Esq<sup>r</sup> being supposed to be Accounts belonging to the Naval Office of that District, And the said Madam Bourn did before his Ex<sup>ty</sup> in Council make Oath that she would further deliver up unto George Plater Esq<sup>r</sup> or other person whom his Ex<sup>ty</sup> should appoint all other
