at Solving of Arms

The Deposition of Edward Burges Gentle of Am Arrundell County
sworne faith that on the Eleventh day of November in the year
of our Lord 1693 the Deponent Received of Doct. Mordcay Moore
fourty & five Muskets Belonging to the Magazine of the above
said County & thereof four of them wanted Locks & also Received of
the said Doct. one hundred & sixty pound weight of Ball & Shot
and likewise fifty six pound of Powder whereof y^e Deponent
Delivered to the Ord. of Capt. Richard Hill thirty nine of y^e said
Muskets and all the above Ammunition Except about six pound of
Powder and about seven or eight pound of Shot (w^{ch} the other six
Muskets to make up y^e full number of y^e above 45: w^{ch} was
Contained out of my hands by Maj. Nicholas Towall & out of
those thirty & nine Muskets that was sent as above said to Capt.
Hill your Deponent Received back but thirty & one & four of y^e
said Number wanted Locks and some times found those thirty
& one Muskets by the Ord. of Col. Nicholas Greenberry your
Deponent shall delivered into the Custody of Capt. Nicholas
Gaspaway and further your Deponent sayeth not
