His Ex<sup>cy</sup> has been pleased to communicate to us your Letter to him  
the Council of Maryland (from no place) of the first of March 1695 wherein you take  
Notice that his Ex<sup>cy</sup> your Gover<sup>r</sup>. Received a Lett. purposed  
to be from his Ex<sup>cy</sup> our present Gover<sup>r</sup>. though not signed  
by him, which if so, was occasioned by Mistake and not  
designed. We therefore send you now here inclosed a Duplicate  
thereof, as also of the two papers then sent therewith to his  
Ex<sup>cy</sup> your Gover<sup>r</sup>. — Your Lett. with an Acc<sup>t</sup> of Gover<sup>r</sup> —  
Copleys protested Bill & Damages amounting to the sume of  
453. Sterling were sent to the House of Burgesses and their answer  
thereto is likewise inclosed. — As to his their Ma<sup>t</sup> Government of  
Maryland being indebted to their Ma<sup>t</sup> Province of New York  
touching the Bills of Exchange the late Gover<sup>r</sup>. Copley paid and  
remitted to your Gover<sup>r</sup>. We find nothing entered in the Journals  
of the Council relating to that Affair, and therefore look upon  
it as Gover<sup>r</sup>. Copleys Private Act, — But when ever their  
Royal Ma<sup>t</sup> are pleased to Command our assistance in defense of  
their Province of New York against the French or others their  
Ma<sup>t</sup> Enemies, all ready and due Obedience shall be given by —
