That as to the Bill of Exchange in the Lett<sup>r</sup> of their Ma<sup>ty</sup>  
Hon<sup>ble</sup> Council of New York; this House know not any  
thing of it - It appears to be drawn by his Excellency  
Govern<sup>r</sup> (Copy), but whether for service of this Province  
or not is unknown to us nor does any Request or consent  
of the Representative Body of this Province appear for  
the same This We humbly Represent unto your Excellency  
as the sense of this House on the premises praying your  
Excellency and the Councils concurrence therewith.

Scotland France and Ireland Defenders of the Faith &c To all  
persons to whom these presents shall come greeting Know ye  
that Whereas Thomas Nolley Esq<sup>r</sup> one of the former Govern<sup>rs</sup>  
of this our Province under the R<sup>t</sup> Hon<sup>ble</sup> Charles Lord Baltimore  
Lord & Proprietary of the same did, by his certain Lease under  
the Seper Seal of the said Province bearing Date the fourteenth  
day of Jan<sup>y</sup> 1678: (for & in consideration of the Rents and Covenants  
therein Express'd) Demise set and to farm Lett unto one John Baker  
late of our City of St<sup>t</sup> Maries Inholder & etc a certain Messuage or  
Tenement situate Lying and being within the aforesaid City commonly  
known and called by the Name of the Country House, together  
with one Acre and one fourth of an Acre of Land to the said Messuage  
belonging withall out houses edifices &c for & during the Term of  
Twenty five Years being limited and bounded as by the said Lease remaining  
upon Record in the Secretaries Office of this our said Province  
being thereunto had may fully & at Large appear w<sup>ch</sup> said Messuage Lease
