John Edlons Letter to his Ex^{ty} being produced and read at the Board therein craving to have the Conduct & Charge of Baltimore County Rangers conferred upon him, who is approved off accordingly by the Board and Ordered that he present Six Men besides fit for that Service, unto the Hon. Col. Nicholas Greenbury for his Approbation and that he duly comply with the late Act of Assembly passed relating thereto; his Ex^{ty} being pleased to signify that he has purchased Locks and Hatchets for all the Rangers by Act appointed, which they should have, upon their Making good the same to his Ex^{ty}. And that the Hon. Col. Nicholas Greenbury take Receipt for the same.

Produced Copy of a Record from Baltimore County Court setting forth that Mr. George Ashman, & Mr. John Hall (Justices appointed in the late Commission of Peace to that County sent & directed) did obstinately Refuse to serve, it was thereupon Ordered that the said Ashman & Hall be bound over to Answer at the Next Provincial Court for such their Contempt, and that Mr. Attorney Gen^l prosecute the same Accordingly But the said Ashman having since by Petition made his humble Submission to his Ex^{ty} is excused upon condition of his willing- performance of his Duty hereafter

Proplanch Indians Complaint against Maj. Taylor in trenching upon their Land & Order thereupon

Several Proplanch Indians appearing here at the Board made Complaint that Maj. Thomas Taylor of Dorchester County had in trenched upon their Land given and Granted them by the Lord Baltimore to live upon; therefore prayed Redress in the premises; it was thereupon Ordered that the Hon. Col. George Robotham, Col. Charles Hutchins, Doct. Jacob Lockerman, Mr. Thomas Eussally and Mr. Thomas Hicks meet at Cambridge Town in Dorchester County the 19th Day of March Next and Call before them, as well the said Maj. Taylor as the Indians aft. and make due and strict inquiry into the Premises, and if possible to get the said Matter accomodated; And further that Mr. Smithson Resurvey the said Land, according to Order of Council in the Lord Baltimore's time

Commissioners ordered to constitute Col. Robotham & Col. Greenbury Judge of Admiralty Court on the Eastern Shore, Col. Hutchins & Mr. Eussally & Mr. Hicks
