To his Excy the Governor and Council in Council sitting.
(The Humble Petition of Henry Denton.)

allowances &c etc
of the Hon^{ble} Council
& Ord^{re} thereon

That the last Gen^{le} Assembly held at the City of St^t Maries our
Pet^r humbly set forth to yo^r Excy and Hon^{ble} howe that the house of Burg^{hs}
were p^daged to allow your Pet^r (or Clerk of the Council) for his Years
Selling the sume of Tenthion f^{or} pounds of tobacco being wth them
former Clerks in that Station usually have had. —

That during that space of time he had been at a considerable charge in
attending upon Councils called to places remote from the City of St^t Maries
without any satisfaction for the same & partly that the house had
enitted to make any allowance to y^r Pet^r for his attendance &
paines bestowed on Clerke of this Hon^{ble} Board in Assembly then
Sitting a thing altogether unpresidentiall. —

That your Excy and this Hon^{ble} Board were (upon the afo^r Representations
pleased to recommend unto the house the severall particulars before mentioned
for their allowance, who considered upon the sume of 2000=
of Tobacco in full of all, so absolutely putt of your Pet^r from the remall
allowance made to the Clerke of this Board as likewise his itinerant
charges afo^r mentioned, an Acc^t. whereof lay then before the house.

That your Pet^r doo^r conceive it altogether in vain to make any further
Acre^s to the house of Burg^{hs}, therefore humbly applies himself to your
Excy and Hon^{ble} for Reliefe in the promiss^r humbly signifying a certain
Income now lying in the Guist of your Excy Council, namely the
Americaments of the Provincialle Court, by an Act of Assembly of this Province
settled to be disposed off as the Goverⁿ & Council shall think fit, whereby your
Pet^r hopes his present circumstances (through your Excy Council's favour) may
in some measure at present be conuinced, a List of which said Americaments by
Your Pet^r found out and discovered to be due he hath here now ready to
present. —

Your Pet^r further Reprients some considerable Charge he hath been at in
purchasing paper and Ink &c toward the Manag^t of the Bu^rgs of this
Office and a Large paper Book for Entering the proceedings of y^r Council, —
Humbly also craving allowance for the same. —

And your Pet^r is in duty Bound
