

By His Excellency the Governour and Council  
March 3<sup>rd</sup> 1694

Ordered that all the Arrears<sup>t</sup> belonging to the Province<sup>t</sup> and accruing from the Seventh day of July 1691. until Feb<sup>y</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> last past be by the severall Sheriffs of the Province accounted for and paid unto Henry Denton Clarke of their Mat<sup>ty</sup> Hon<sup>rs</sup> Council and not to their Mat<sup>ty</sup> Receiver. This Board having bestowed the same upon the said Denton for severall Services by him performed and expences disbursed in the Execution of his Office -
