power see that their Ma<sup>ty</sup> Rights shall be duly maintained & all fines and  
forfeitures that shall fall before me shall be duly entered & a fair Record  
thereof made I will not delay nor hinder Justice nor take any bribe  
gift or Reward to the Intent to delay prevent or hinder the same but in  
all things to the best of my Judgm<sup>t</sup> will carry and behave my selfe in the said  
Office Justly & honestly so long as I shall continue in the same &c.

Oath of Register of  
Vice Admiralty

You as Clerk or Regist<sup>r</sup> of this Hon. Court shall make just & true Entry of all such  
Judgm<sup>t</sup> Orders, Decrees, Rules, Process or Proceedings that shall be adjudged, Proceeded  
decreed, Ruled or Proceeded in, by & before their Ma<sup>ty</sup> most Hon. Judges of the said  
Court, and a just true and fair Record you shall duly & truly make or cause to  
be made thereof; You shall do no fals hood nor consent to any to be done in the  
Court, and if you know of any you shall inform the Ex<sup>cy</sup> the Govern<sup>r</sup> or other  
Judge of the same Court that it may be reformed you shall delay no man  
that has to do with you in your said office, either for Envy, hatred or hope of  
gain; You shall increase no fees but be content with the fees limited or  
to be limited by Law or the Order of the Court; and finally you shall well  
& faithfully execute the Office of Clerk or Register of this Hon. Court, while you  
shall continue in the same, & till you shall be lawfully discharged thereof -
