The severall Members of their Ma^{ty} Hon^{ble} Council sign a Letter, them writt to their Ma^{ty} Council of New York, in Answer to a Lett^r sent from the said Council of the 1st of March 1694. His Ex^{ty} demand to know whether any further Answer shall be given than what they have writt, who make answer that they do imagine they have writt full enough already.

Order that James Crawford be discontinued from any publick place of Office

Ordered that if James Crawford of Calvert County does at present, officiate any publick place or places of profit within this Province that he be discontinued from hence forth to act any further in the same and that some other person or persons be constituted in his stead.

That forasmuch as upon a hearing in Matter of Law, upon a Judgment of the Provincials Court concerning the Seizure of the Ship Anne from which the said Ship was discharged by Voluntary Judgment of the said Court, the same Judgment is reversed whereby the said Ship is become liable to a second Tryall, as to the fact, and forasmuch as the Loading is ready for the said Ship and shal ready to take it in if cleared, or if not the said Cargo may be otherwise disposed.
