 and appoint you to be Navall Officer of the Town

 to Exercise the Soverall Powers therein contained & to observe  
 all such direction as you shall from time to time Receive from  
 me Relating to the duty of the said Office, and all Officers -  
 Civil & Military & their Ma<sup>ty</sup> Loving Subjects are hereby desired  
 and Comanded to be aiding and assisting to you the said  
 in the due Execution of your Office, Given vnder My hand and  
 Seal at the \_\_\_\_\_ of this day of \_\_\_\_\_ in the  
 Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord the King Anno Domj: 169

Ordered that the Clorck of each respective County give Notice  
 to the Soverall Militia Officers vnder their Comand that they  
 publish and make known to their Respective Troops and  
 Companies that they provide themselves with Arms & Amunition  
 pursuant to the Act of Assembly of this Province this last  
 Session made and Enacted, and that they slip not the opportunity  
 of sending by this Fleet.

 Burgesses agreement made with Capt. Perry which accordingly issued  
 was signed by his Ex<sup>ty</sup> and passed the Broad Seal of the Province

Whereas the Burgesses and Delegates at a Gen<sup>l</sup> Assembly of  
 this Province begun & held at Annapolis the eighth day of May  
 instant have thought fit for their Ma<sup>ty</sup> Service & benefit of the  
 Countrey & promoting the post Office to appoint and settle some  
 person of Trust and integrity to keep going betwixt the River of  
 Potomack in Maryland & Philadelphia in Pennsylvania in the  
 Nature of a Post for the quick and speedy dispatch of Letters &c  
 And forasmuch as the said Burgesses & Delegates have Entered  
 into Agreement with one John Perry who has undertaken the  
 said Employ I have thought fit for information of the inhabitants  
 of this Province to Publish and make known & Give Notice by
