command those Men where to largely turn the
Country. Instructions as the present Rangers who
are to be paid accordingly to Act of Assembly but it is Ordered
that Captain Brightwell be not one of them and Officers
which said Men & Officers are to be raised with all Expedi-
tion possible & placed some where convenient for Strength-
ening the Frontier Plantations as the said Coll^e Addison
is fit & most serviceable to his Majesty & safety of the
Country it being thought Unlikely to keep them at the
Garrison now for there is a peace & no fear of any French
or other Indians attacking those parts besides the Return of
the Piscaway Indians may now about this time be expe-
cted whether they come at all yet it is thought necessary that
the Old Rangers be still continued and kept in Service &
pay until the New ones be rightly equipped & established
and afterwards be dismissed & disbanded which is ordered
Accordingly April the 3 1698.
