Speaker gave to the Committee of Grievances & whether
any Charge was given them before he had the Oath of Secre-
cy administered to him as Clerk of the house he says that
the Speaker did give a Charge to the Committee of Gri-
evances before such Oath administered, ^{which Charge was to the effect following} viz. that he would
have them to Enquire the reason how the Levy came to be
higher now than in the last Baltimore's time or would to
that Effect which was all that was Given them in charge
at that time before his being sworn to Secrecy

And the said M^r Bladen made Oath thereto accor-
dingly before his Excellency in Council
