

The said James Fustey Esq; was referred to his
Majestys Council at Law on the 11th of Oct^r 1708
who reports that he is of opinion his Lordships Agents
ought to have time allowed him to bring in the necessary
particulars of his Lordships Charter in the meantime that
if any wrong be done to the planters they may be relieved
by an action brought according to the ordinary course of
Proceedings at Law.

his hands as escheated without a Jury of Enquiry found

Coll^d Parnell says that the Lord Baltimore has al-
ways claimed escheat Lands in this province his Excellency
asks Coll^d Parnell how he acts upon the tales of such
Lands without an exemplification or Duplicate of his
Lordships Charter Coll^d Parnell says he has a copy of it
which he being required to produce says it is returning to my
Lords Privy Council who hath it not about them

The honble James Fustey Esq^r says that his Father
in the time of the Lord Baltimore bought some Land
of his Lordship which was escheated & so found by a
Jury of Enquest

Whereupon it is observed that the reason why the
Lord Baltimore's Agent do not get the Office for Escheats
settled in this province is because his Lordship will not
do any one act to acknowledge his Majestys Government
here
