Submain omission & negligence had & with the  
advice of the Gentleman of the Council is pleased to order  
that his Suspension be taken of but that he be not admis-  
sed w<sup>t</sup> influence Georges County & Charles nor  
yet in any other part of the Province until he has  
made his Application by Col<sup>t</sup> Courts to his Excellency  
for the same being

Find a Letter from his Ex<sup>r</sup> the Earl of Bellamont  
dated at New York the 12<sup>th</sup> of November 1698 Which  
being forwarded the Indians there it is advised to  
be communicated to his Excellency Col<sup>t</sup> Blakiston  
for his Majestys Service

Intend that his Majestys Receiver send home  
to England the sum of the 3<sup>d</sup> of June.
