

His Excellency is pleased to say that he will pay the Balance to His Excellency Col^l Blakiston to be in his hands until his Majesty's Pleasure shall be known in regard thereto & that he hath thought fit to address his Majesty & acquaint him that the Country is pretty well supplied with Corn & other necessaries

Ordered and read a Letter from Mr Geo. Subman of Charles County to Major William Dent & another in which he writes to his Excellency dated the 15th of November praying his Excellency's Clemency & Mercy

Upon which his Excellency being pleased to ask Col^l Counts how Mr Subman had of late behaved himself he says he has heard well of him & Major Dent being asked says he has lived very privately & retired & seems to be heartily sorry for his Error & Misapprehension & upon consideration had of the said Mr Subman's contrition & submission his Exc^t with the advice of the Gentlemen of the Council is pleased to order that his Suspension be taken off but that he be not admitted to officiate in France Georges County & Charles nor yet in any other part of the Province until he has made his Application by Col^l Counts to his Exc^t the Gov^r for the time being

Read a Letter from his Exc^t the Earl of Bellamont dated at New York the 12th of November 1698 Which being concerning the Indians there it is advised to be communicated to his Excellency Col^l Blakiston for his Majesty's Service

Ordered that his Majesty's Receivers send home to England the due of the 3^d of June
