In consideration of the Your Maj. & Council
I have considered the Question & perused the Autho-
rity bearing of the Subject and find that it is his
Majesty's Prorogative Royal to call Parogue &
adjourn Parliament at his Royal will & pleasure
and I take it that his Majesty hath delegated
his Authority for the Government of this Province
in that Country your Excellency with the advice
of the honorable Council were peculiar to his Majes-
ty's command

That taking as we ought the King's Pleasure
I will to have a considerable Regard to the Nations
Good and Welfare I am inclined to the Opinion
that his Majesty on great & imminent Occasions
by virtue of the Prorogative Royal may call or Par-
liament sooner than the precedent adjournment
appointed but that I have not an express Author-
ity for at present but by a natural deduction of
the Premise & if it may be so in the Province
