It being signified to the Board that some  
at Hove by Hove & Croydon waylaid the un-  
lawful Brigands & said of them further advised  
that some to be taken thereon that it be referred  
to the Assembly to judge the same.

It being moved at the Board by Mr Attorney Gen<sup>r</sup>  
that whereas the Vice Admiralty Court is binden  
at the Court of Admiralty & the Master Vice  
Admiral remits an appeal from the sentence of the  
said Court to the High Court of Admiralty in England  
the Board doth pray the advice of the Board in what Case  
and to what Court such appeal shall be granted  
Whereupon his Majestys Royal Commission to his  
Excellency being produced & due consideration had of  
that clause directing appeals from this Province this  
Board are of opinion that when appeals are made  
from this Province to England they ought to be from  
and before the Governor & Council here to his most  
humble Majesty in his most humble Privy Council  
wherefore that his Majestys Pleasure seems plainly  
to be signified in his Excellencys Commission where  
in the manner of appeals intended & therefore advise  
that of the said Captain Knuts he will first appeal to  
the Excellency the Governor & Council here that from  
them if he cannot satisfy he may have an appeal  
to his Majesty in Council & not otherwise.

Moved by his Excellency the Governor that whereas  
in this Place is the seat of Government but that the  
Province is small and does not afford a competent  
Number for any good deserving man to officiate here
