was as well for his Excellency as others in the Provincial
Court here which should happen at the same time his
Excellency thought to have adjourned the Provincial Court
but afterwards meeting several of the Council whoe how-
ever he had been at in his late proues they were of the
Contrary opinion for that they did not think the ordina-
rys in this form would be capable to supply & enter-
tain both the Assembly & Provincial Court at one & the
same time & that his Excellency considering that he was
but newly arrived he did not know what construction
the people might put upon such adjournment & that
for those reasons he had wrote to the Governor of Virginia
that Major Dent could not then wait upon his Excell-
