His Excellency gives them to understand that
we have not any design of Advantage from them but
that the King has thought it necessary they may be kindly
told & that it is most for their Advantage to be quiet
ly & amply as they are

Tells them that several Nations have been com-
mitted of Trade & diverse persons injured that we do
not certainly know who it was that has done it but
hope it was not them they absolutely deny they are
guilty of any such thing

His Excellency observes to them how they have
shuffled & cut of Hon & broke their Articles so
that it was but Reasonable to suspect them tells them
he expects they should be very punctual to what is
promised & performed otherwise he will not further
treat with them but leaves them to take their own
Measure

They answer that the Indians have a good
heart & will do no Prejudice to any body that does
not hurt them & desire his Excellency not to believe
any thing against them

His Excellency assures them that he will at
ways have one care for the English & one for the
Indians

His Excellency tells the Indians of Perattoway
that in case his Indians are refractory & will not
be kept within bounds & Measures but do such irregular
