& that no Body shall come to distract them in their lands  
in any thing belonging to them & as to the Emperor's  
Building his Palace he is directed to apply to the Assembly  
by suspending some of his men when the General As-  
sembly sits.

The Indians complain that the English will  
steal their horses in Peers and hinder their hunting his  
Excellency says he will take care for the future to pre-  
vent that

They are told of their Branch of Indians and a few  
if they are now far to enter into neugnes to which  
they say they are

And it being concluded & agreed upon that the King  
should with his wife & Children within two months  
come in to live at flamenckey & do his accustomed  
ways to persuade the rest of the Indians to do so  
likewise

Ordered that Articles of peace be prepared with  
the Allyement last mentioned inserted & in all other  
Point as they were before

Ordered also that Articles of peace be prepared  
for the flamenckey Indians
