

that then he & Collet my self pleased to give every
one of the said Indians presents & of greater value to
Col. James for his Master the King of Pamunkey
& to the Emperor of Hudson King & the others of
greater Note.

And then told them to come before him next
morning to sign the said articles of peace.

Tuesday April 9th 1700

Now therefore the Governor & the Indians again
will be more particular before

The following articles being prepared & read were
considered agreed to be signed by the subscribers as
followeth viz.

The first article of peace & Unity concluded
& agreed upon between his Ex: Nathaniel
Blakewell Esq Captain General & Governor
in Chief of over th his Maj: Province of
Maryland & the Territory thereunto belonging
& Captain-mayor & Inhabitants of Piscataway
the 9th day of April 1700.

Agreed to. It is agreed upon that from this day
forward there shall be inviolable peace & amity between
his most. honored Majority King William the third of
England & his subjects the inhabitants of this
Province & the Inhabitants of Piscataway upon the
conditions hereafter mentioned to the whole and to endure
& shall all persons & of Hostility of Pamunkey
whatever by either party sustained be reduced in
sufficient O'leary.
