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6. In case any Indians or Slaves run away from their Master & come to any of the Indians knownes without the boundrye of the said Cayucomayuate & shall be founde by any of the said Indians they shall be bounde & apprehended the said Cayucomayuate & bring them to the next compleat Plantation to be Conveyed to their Master & if any Indian or Slave run away from his Master & be founde in their Plantation shall conveyer at his Master's commandment shall make the best & fairest Master in Manner of such Servants or Slaves such satisfaction as an English man ought to do in like Case.

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7. That the said Cayucomayuate shall not make any new place with our enemies nor shall make any war without the command of the Gov'r of this Province for the time being.

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8. In case the said Cayucomayuate or any Indian subject to him shall kill any Indians or any other in peace and friendly with his said Majestie it shall be esteemed a great offence as killing an Englishman.

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9. That within the said Empire no any of the Indians under his subjection do at any time hereafter keep harbour or entertain amongst them or within their fort any foreign or strange Indians or knowe or do any such to appear or come within the Province without giving timely and all possible & speedy notice therof to his Excellency the Governor or some other Officer a person of note by whom the same may be communicated withall Cayucomayuate to the said Governor or Gov'r of this Province for the same being for his advice & Direction therein
