

I will suffer to be done to any Indians  
or any other Indians to my self or to any  
of them by any of his men or officers  
it shall be taken as great an offence as if it had been  
done by the King.

9. That neither the said Simplicius nor  
any of the Indians under his command do at any  
time hereafter keep hardware or ironmonger  
things or whatsoever may be used to injure or come into  
this Province without giving timely & all Possible  
warning thereto to his Excellency the Governor  
& any other Officer a copy of Note by whom the  
same may be communicated with all expedition to  
the said Govr or Govr of this Province for the time  
being for his Advice & Direction therein.

10. That as a further testimony of their League  
Peace & Friendship with his Majesty & as they  
expect Protection from him & the Govr here there  
is paid by the said Simplicius as a Tribute  
to his Majestys Am. Indian Br. to be given  
to be delivered to his Excellency the Governor in the  
Governorship commanding at his instance wheresoever  
the same shall happen between the first Tuesday in  
April in every year successively —

11. And lastly as a full & ample Proof of and  
evidence of the said League & fidelity unto & our  
country she does solemnly promise engage & oblige  
herself with her Indians within two months time  
to come and live at Pemunkey & that she will do  
her utmost endeavour to forward & oblige all her
