of August 1699 which was sent with the reasons

Excellency explained a particular point to the Board his
Majesty's Royal Commission returning to the Treasury
the sum of three pounds.

And he pleased to take Notice that upon the
Principal of the said sum in the General Assembly
to pay all the said sum then remitted for trans-
mitted over One month before that Assembly
through a man of the same nation were then united
whence one side and that at that time there was all
possible care taken that nothing should be in-
cluded among of them infringing his Majesty's Pro-
tection or otherwise required his Interest but that
as to the act of Religion &c it having so long depo-
& being a law professed to the prosperity & well
fare of the Country it was absolutely necessary
to be retained.

His Excellency explained to show the Board
his own letter which he shew'd in answer to
that & his found upon further consideration had
of their Lordships said Letter reflecting they had run
into the like Error to the sum for undertaking the
sum for the purpose aforesaid & resolve that upon the
next meeting of the Assembly it be recommended
to them a Report & make void that sum which is
not at all wanted.
