The same will then be rendered applicable to his
Majesty's friends.

As to the rest of Religion we were very apprehensive
of the disagreeableness of the clause of a Declaration
law which made the clause of his Majst dis^{re}s
onable. However had we did not shew most y^e entreated
him to vary better. From that time back I hoped for
a favourable opportunity to purge out those
irregularities than which the mind of the Assembly
would then allow of which in hope it will in some
measure vindicate us for that reason its withdrawal
during that the said law had but a considerable time
before your Lordships without any disapprobation of
his Majesty would otherwise his Ex^r H^r Blakiston
not have entered the Report of that Law before his
Majesty. Pleasee you know wherein besides
what he would have Begot in the greatest & most
Eminent place of the Virginie who are unnessecary
to account for establishing the Protestant Religion
than an execracy of her Law. You will see that which
I apprehend has retarded; we could not certainly tell
what other amendment might be required besides the
insertion all which we hope by this Revised in
England to qualify us to procure his Majestys
Grace & Honour & which with the greatest joy
& most humble acknowledgment we will
shew by a due tract his Majst great subjects here & in
that particularly as well as in all other Affairs in Gen^r
his Ex^r H^r great love & affection to his Majestys Service
and Emminency against all which in Right &
Truth we stand & which we ought to acknowledge to
your great beautifull
