The Council representing to his Excellency that  
whereas the present General Assembly now on foot  
had continued near three years they did believe it  
would be to the General Satisfaction of the Coun-  
try they should be dissolved in the Spring by a new  
one called His Excellency was pleased to assent  
thereto but without Recurriture that having no In-  
struction from his most Sacred Majesty the Right  
Honble the Lord Comptroller of the Exchequer Plan  
having he<sup>r</sup> in that point to follow the tenor of  
Parliament made in his Majestys Kingdom of  
England for dissolution of the Parliament there  
every three years he did not hold himself obliged  
to follow that Example where not knowing how  
far it might be agreeable to his Majestys Inclinations
