At the Port of Annapolis

Wednesday November 19 1701

Then came Sir Thomas Lawrence & Barnwell before  
his Excellency the Governor & the honble Col<sup>t</sup> John  
Hammond of his Majestys Council & produced his  
Majestys Letters patent of the 11<sup>th</sup> of July 1701 apointing  
the said Sir Thomas Lawrence to be his May-  
ster of this Province

Whereupon his Excellency is pleased to observe  
that altho the swearing of such Officers has usually  
been before the Governor and Council yet that all due  
respect & regard might be had to his Majestys Com-  
mission to the said Sir Thomas Lawrence & that the  
said Sir Thomas might not be prejudiced in being  
unable to act on his said Station for want of being  
sworn and subscribing the Test of Association ordered  
to be either appointed by act of Parliament instead of the  
Catholick Allegiance & supremacy & the oath of Securany  
to be administered to the said Sir Thomas Lawrence
