Whereas the Clerk of the General Assembly
has written to me

The Council have upon previous consideration
Captain Nathaniel Boston's Letter of the 29th Inst
being and regarding the Board to limit his one hundred
Pounds. Paid for the support of her Majestys Advice Board
Eighty pounds altemately this Province under his Command.

The said Captain Boston being called into this Board
that the Board has considered of his Letter & are heartily
muy that it is within their power to assist him in so great
an Emergency & that no instructions have been given this
Gentleman to the said Captain Boston to apply to them for
any funds or otherwise.

That since that her Majesty has no money here
but the 3^d of that which is particularly directed to be applied
in providing this Province with a Constant Magazine
of Arms & Ammunition they cannot supply the want
of these men. Not having power to dispose of that
money any otherwise than as intended and directed. How
ever that her Majestys Service may not suffer do acquain
Captain Boston that upon this passing Occasion they
will pay him 100^l. And provided he will give good
Country Security to refund the same in some reasonable
time.

It being represented to this Board that the Clergymen
are in very indistress to draw away their notable
People of this Province who are not sufficiently instruc
ted in the Principles of their Religion are often seduced &
that the happens much damage from the neglect
of the Clergy in their duty of their Parochial Visits.
