he had received a Silver from the said Mr^r Randolph at
Boston the said Stephen Broke Bulk and the said Pe-
ter Bonny Commanded & that it would be a loss to her
Majestys Revenue to stop the ship in her hunting & Sou-
thing & because it was observed that the said Plater have leave
to have giving security in the sum of three thousand pounds
sterling to another and information by the said Mr^r Randolph
published against the ship & cargo upon the aforesaid
Lizine and the name of Capt William Ball George
Plater Esq. the Majestys Receiver of Pascowet being pre-
sent and official Mr^r & Mr^r Nicholas Mr^r Thomas Bynon
& Mr^r Charles Sandys of Colvile County for his security
where the said Mr^r Plater appeared of & was ordered to
take his passage accordingly.

Upon Edmund Fennings Esq^r his Letter of 23 of Sept^r
1763 as follows

Honble Sir

The Vessel of this city his Lieut^r Commands
to require you that yesterday morning was seen in Lynn
harbor by a very large Ship wearing a flag or very broad
Union Standard at the top mast head and supposed to
be an Enemy his Excellency thinks it very much for his
Majestys Honor and safety with all expedition you
will take up your Command with his Majestys Advice
They under his Command down into this Government
time will not fail to tell me more than that
