ties Ship Capt. Gordon's Boat

Read his Excellency the Governor of Virginia's Letter
of the 24th instant to his Honour the President giving
the Clerk that forasmuch as there were Letters from Engl
advising that a man of war might be shortly expected
to which the Southern Colonies he had laid an Embargo on
the Shipping in that Colony hoping the Ships ready
to sail for England might have the benefit of Carriage under
her Majesty's seal Ship the Southern Colonies
