One hundred pounds were paid to her Majesty's Recie-  
ver of Saguenay of which pay unto the Captain Bostock  
One hundred pounds Sterling for the supply of her Majes-  
ty's Ship Eagle Deliver Bond

Read his Excellency the Governor of Virginia Letter  
of the 1<sup>st</sup> instant to his Excellency the President giving  
in clear that forasmuch as there were Letters from Engt  
advising that a man of war might be shortly expected  
to return the Southwampion he had sent him on  
the shipping in that Colony hoping the Ship ready  
to bid for England might have the benefit of Convoy under  
her Majestys said Ship the Southwampion

Resolved that the General Assembly be prorogued  
until the first day of February next.
