and representeth that on July last Mr John Carrol Clerk  
of the Privy to the Lord Baltimore told me that there  
were eight or nine Papers prepared by him & ready to be  
sent to Sir Henry Samuel Secy of my Lord. sent to  
my Office unto them Mr Carrol also delivered to me my  
List of my part of the fee arising from the same in order  
to pay 13000 £ & desired I should send him to order the same  
to come to my Office to be received forthwith because of  
his intention as he declared of going for England on the  
12th he then desired to buy of me my List of fees of 13000  
Pounds for which he offered me little more than 10000
