

Reported that having been all these Patents had not
 been sent but should as soon as he was capable of coming
 to Mr. Gwynne's house as by his letter to Mr. B. dated 4th
 of my. lth of October 1702 but promising that all was
 safe and I am sure on Col^o Parral's part I supplied
 copies to the honorable Board Nov^r 13th and had a further
 Certificate of my lth appearance at the next Council on
 Nov^r 13th. Petitions were not completed with in the mean
 time but nothing being done Col^o Parral did appear
 before the honorable the President Col^o Hammond & Mr
 & not withstanding proposed he might then dispatch them being himself in good health, & shall be for good of Mr. Goodshere's right
 on Jan^y 28th of January last & notwithstanding my lth
 Mr. President offered him time to do it by the latter end
 of March notwithstanding that the Patents might be recorded
 before the next Provincial Council to be then delivered to the
 respective Petitioners & concerned yet did not the said Col^o
 Parral refuse both these proposals giving no reason for
 his refusal but that my Lord B. & his Officers
 were not to be tied up or limited to any certain time but
 to do it when they saw convenient or Wrote to that
 Effect

I do therefore in behalf of her sacred Majesty of the
 Country & of my self in due discharge of my Office lay
 the Petitions before the honorable Board and do desire that
 a peremptory Command may forthwith issue forth
 requiring the said Col^o Henry Parral to send & send in
 the Patents aforesaid to be recorded in the Secretary's
 Office according to the President's proposal by the last
 Day of March next at his Seat
